



MALVERN COTTAGE

DIRECTIONS and PARKING

go Wyche Road, Malvern WR14 4EQ

Malvern is situated 7 miles South West of Worcester. It can be approached from the North by exiting at Junction 7 of the M5 and following directions to Malvern. Approaching from the South, taking the M50 (from Junction 8 of the M5) and exiting at the first junction of the M50 gives access to signs directing the motorist to Malvern through Upton Upon Severn,



Directions to Malvern Cottage from the SOUTH

Exit the M5 at Junction 8 and join the M50

Take the first exit on the M50 (Junction 1)

Follow the road as it bends first to the left, then to the right and take the third exit (right) off the island. (signposted Worcester). You are now on the A38.

Follow the A38 for 3 miles then turn left onto the A4104 to Upton upon Severn.

After crossing the River Severn at Upton, Take a left turn at the island then a right through the town centre (A4104).

Follow the A4104 to the staggered crossroads at Welland. Take the right turn at the cross roads and then the immediate left (the A4104 and sign posts to Malvern Wells)

After a mile the road will turn sharply to the right and join the Wells Road (A 449).

Turn sharp left onto the Wells Road and head up the hill.

At British Camp at the top of the hill turn right (B4232 – past the Malvern Hills Hotel)

This road winds along the top of the Malvern Hills, follow it until it arrives at Upper Colwall (avoid taking any roads the left until the very end of the road)

At the end of the road turn right into Walwyn Road (B4218)

Take the first left (West Malvern Road) then turn immediately to the right (Beacon Road)

Park in Beacon Road. (see map below)

Directions to Malvern Cottage from the NORTH

Exit the M5 at Junction 7 and go right at the Motorway island (A44)

Travel a short distance down the A44 and turn left at the island (signposted Malvern A4440)

Travel directly along the A4440, over two islands, then over the River Severn

Approximately 1 mile later, take the left turn at the major island, into the Malvern Road (A449)

After a short drive, the road curls sharply to the right (do not take the left turn to Upton!). Follow the road round past the Upton turn then turn left (continuing on the A449)

Travel along the A449 (Worcester Road) for approximately 4 miles then cross the small island and travel through Malvern Link

Travel up hill after Malvern Link and follow round to the left after the traffic lights (still following the A449 Worcester Road, into Great Malvern)

Keep travelling into Great Malvern and out through Great Malvern.

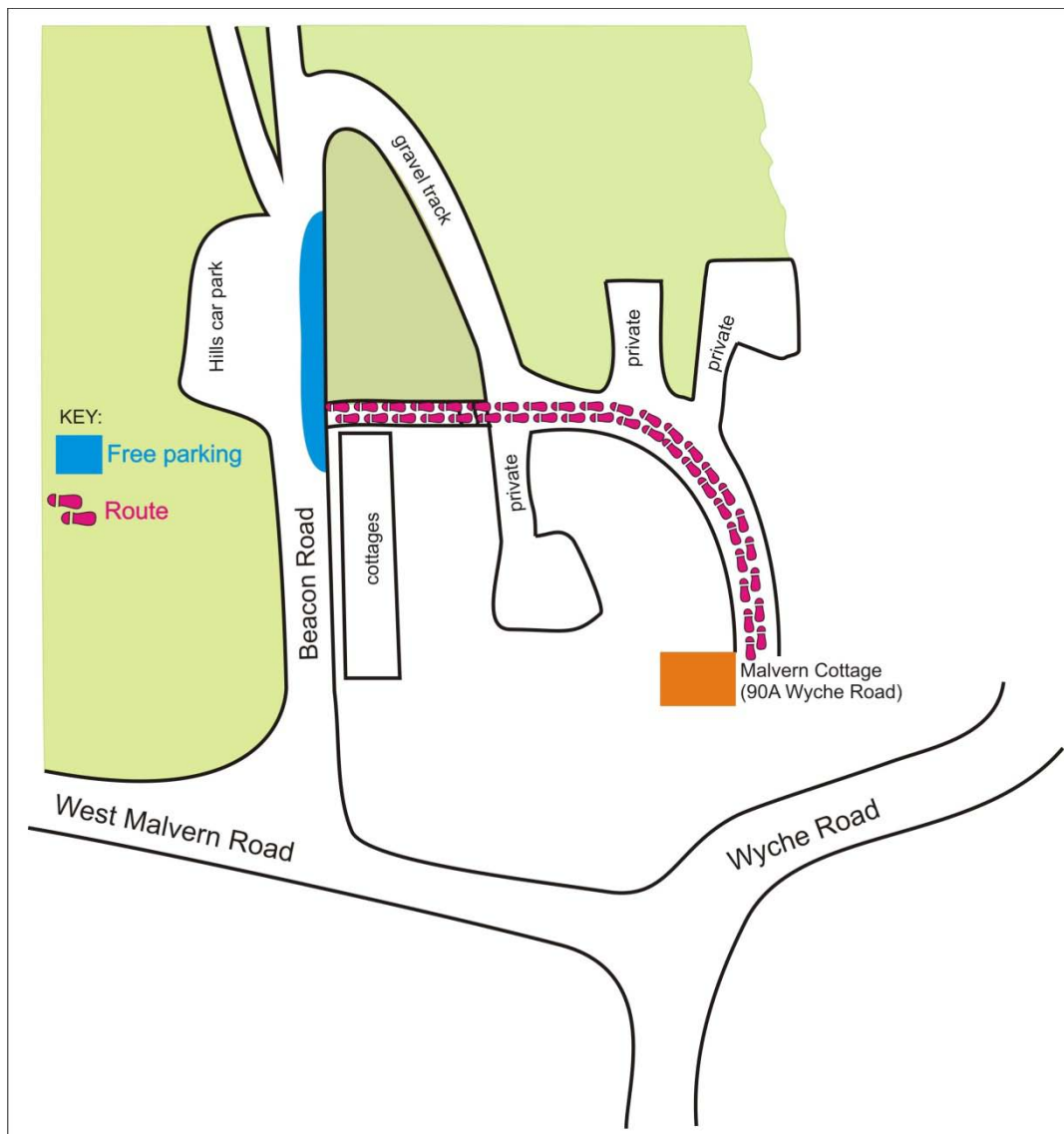
As you join the Wells Road (still the A449) Look out for the turning to the right signposted Colwall (B4218)

Take the B4128 (Wyche Road) and make the steady climb up the hill.

At the top of the hill, the road turns sharp right (directly after the Wyche Inn) and through the stone rock face of the Wyche Cutting

Immediately you are through the Wyche Cutting, take the road to the right (West Malvern Road – B4232) and then turn immediately to the right (Beacon Road)

Park in Beacon Road. (see map below)



Beacon Road contains free parking on the right hand side and a Malvern Hills Car Park is on the left. Tickets can be purchased for £2 for a days parking in the Malvern Hills Car Park. It is recommended that visitors to Malvern Cottage park after Beacon Cottages, next to the grassy bank on the right of Beacon Road (no parking ticket is then necessary). From here there is access to a small grassy path at the end of Beacon Cottages that gives access via some four steps to the gravel track that leads down to Malvern Cottage. If assistance is required with luggage, please contact Malvern Cottage owners who will endeavour to help.

Parking is ordinarily available at the change-over times for Malvern Cottage. However, occasionally at weekends, parking can be in short supply at this popular spot. On these occasions it is recommended that visitors either park outside the Wyche Inn (just before the Wyche Cutting), or further along West Malvern Road.
